A Message from the D.S.

Tithing Is Never Obsolete: Part 2

"Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me. But you ask, 'How are we robbing you?' In tithes and offerings. You are under a curse—your whole nation—because you are robbing me. Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this, says the LORD Almighty, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it (Malachi 3:8-10).

The coming of Jesus Christ ushered in the New Testament dispensation of grace, and thus giving in the New Testament is considered, not a matter of law, but of grace, as when Paul exhorted the Corinthians to "abound in this grace also [the grace of giving]" (2 Corinthians 8:7). There are those who would evade tithing on this basis. However, it must be remembered that Jesus said, "Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfill" (Matthew 5:17). In His discussion of this principle as further recorded in Matthew 5, He made it plain that the gospel implied, *not less, but more* than the law. In other words, "Grace equals law *plus*." The teachers of the law and the Pharisees had not caught this point very well. They tithed, but had neglected other important matters. Jesus admonished the teachers and Pharisees to *also* give attention to "justice, mercy and faithfulness" *without* "neglecting" the tithe (Matthew 23:23-24).

Therefore if the tithe represented the minimum financial responsibility to God under the law, surely grace cannot imply less. If withholding tithes was considered as robbing God in Old Testament times, it cannot be less under grace. And furthermore, if tithing constituted a basis for spiritual blessing under law, certainly no less will be required in the full light of the Christian dispensation. So we may be assured that tithing has the full support of humanity's sense of obligation to God, of Old Testament Scriptures, of the teaching of Jesus Christ, and of New Testament thought and practice.

An old German proverb reads: "What I spent I *had*. What I saved I *lost*. What I gave I *have*." The concept is a simple one. Our tithe and whatever else we give to God is never lost. In fact, it continues to multiply long after we're gone. Go ahead. Put God to the test on this, then get ready to experience the miracle of giving to Him!

FUNDING THE MISSION

This is the first year for the new funding formula, WWW.FUNDINGTHEMISSION.ORG. The success of this formula depends on every church participating and giving 16% of their income to help others including WEF, MVNU, Pensions, and district operations. One component of this formula is every church must enter their data at least monthly to allow the local church and the district to track their progress. As of today, 73% or 43 of our churches do not have up to date information entered. This means, that even if your church is up to date in your giving according to your records, we will not be able to recognize you at convention for being a Mission Priority One church. It is imperative that every church put their information into the system. 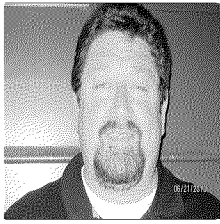

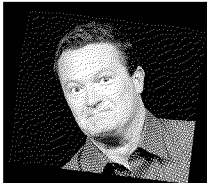

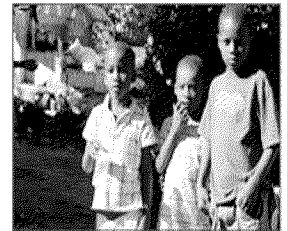
