A Message from the D.S.

Tithing Is Never Obsolete: Part 3

“Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me. But you ask, ‘How are we robbing you?’ In tithes and offerings. You are under a curse—your whole nation—because you are robbing me. Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this, says the LORD Almighty, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it (Malachi 3:8-10).

Tithing is challenging...

1. Tithing Challenges Our Obedience – The consistent payment of the tithe presents the Christian with an opportunity to exercise obedience in a practical way to give actual proof of one’s consecration to God. Obedience to God is not a matter of sentiment but involves detailed demonstration.
2. Tithing Challenges Our Faith – “I’ll tithe when I can afford it,” is an excuse heard frequently. But no one ever has become a tither by waiting until it could be “afforded.” The devil always can propose plenty of excuses for such delay. But God expects us to meet this challenge to faith, and regardless of whether we have much or little, pay our tithes as an expression of our confidence in the promise of the Lord, “Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness: and all these things shall be added unto you.”
3. Tithing Challenges Us to Consistent Responsibility – Anything that will define and place responsibility is invaluable to the Christian. Tithing does this. “Now concerning the collection...,” say Paul, “upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him” (1 Cor. 16:1-2). “Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse” (Malachi 3:10). Here is definite responsibility.
4. Tithing Challenges Us to a Spiritual Outlook – Christian stewardship is essentially a spiritual experience, a personal relationship to Jesus Christ. But it involves “things,” and the proof of faithful stewardship is found largely in our attitude toward the things entrusted to us as stewards. Tithing challenges us to consider **OUR** money in the light of spiritual values. How much do we want the outpoured blessing of God? Tithing alone will not necessarily bring such blessing, but without the tithe such spiritual blessing *cannot come*.

Go ahead. Put God to the test on this, then get ready to experience the miracle of giving to Him!

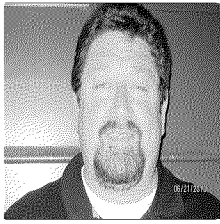

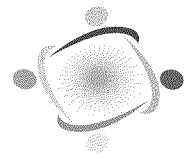

The Church of the Nazarene has a history of revival activity and evangelism. In 1978, Dr. Les Parrott, shared some concerns that I think are still relevant for us today:

"The church is striving to cope with a cultural revolution. Forces are working against the spirit of revival. There are inhibiting powers and principalities on the move from without and within. The tides of social change have rolled through the denomination. This revolution is pervasive. All the expected things have been done to cope with these cultural changes. Now is not the time to shelve the regularly scheduled revivals. Now is not the time to substitute big promotional events for the work of personal evangelism. Mass evangelism needs personal evangelism and personal evangelism needs mass evangelism. But more important than either of these techniques is the need for the spirit of revival which must go through continuing stages of renewal in the local church." (Parrott, Les. *The Spirit of Revival*. Beacon Hill Press of Kansas City, 1978.)

What are we doing to cultivate the spirit of revival in our local churches?

When the local church schedules revival services, are we faithful and supportive?

Are we expecting a fresh and mighty move of God?
